If 2021 was a bounce back year from the pandemic, and it was, 2022 was over the top in terms of numbers and that means a big payoff to our member munici+palities. They can use that income from the Western Regional Off-Track Betting Corporation (WROTBC) to help reduce local property taxes and for other needs.

WROTBC is a public benefit corporation that provides revenue to our member municipalities comprised of 15 counties and two cities. In 2022, that distribution totaled more than \$8.5 million, up from the bounce back year of 2021 when the distribution was a most impressive \$5.8 million after the dismal pandemic year numbers of 2020. The money which is distributed, was derived from hotel, restau+rant, and video game revenue after paying out winnings and from the surcharge on parimutual betting.

The staggering numbers, the highest ever, were reached despite the Park Rd. improvement project from March through November that made access difficult. Nonetheless our loyal patrons from near and far found a way to get to Batavia Downs and enjoy all that we offer, including our first full year of hotel operations and our very popular summer concerts which feature big name entertainment. In short, a remarkable success story made possible by the tireless effort of our employees to make it a welcoming environment for all our customers.

Our patrons can enjoy excellent and very friendly customer service anywhere they choose to visit at Batavia Downs. We have 84 luxury rooms and suites operated by Hart Hotels just upstairs from our extremely popular

gaming floor featuring over 910 games. Come visit to our out+
standing restaurants where you will find incredible food for your
enjoyment. There is also live racing for several months and
our own mobile site called "Batavia Bets" that enables cus+
tomers to go online and place bets on the country's most
popular tracks. Of course, the major horse racing events



REDUCING LOCAL PROPERTY TAX

Batavia Downs continued it's COVID-19 recovery in 2022 with record breaking months and the highest yearly net win number of all time. The year end net win number of \$76 Million was a 14.5% increase over 2021's \$66 Million. Returning and new events helped introduce guests to the property, generating revenue from ticket sales, food and beverage purchases, and the gaming floor. The acquisition of the hotel proved to be an asset as Hotel Revenues were higher than the previtous management team had ever seen. New strategies for generating bookings increased room revenue and allowed guests to visit all onsite amenities.

With record revenues from gaming, hotel, ticket, and restaurant outlets came record distributions to member municipalities – over \$8.4 Million was distributed amounts our 17 members in 2022.

Our Legal and "Statutory Objective"

The Western Regional Off-Track Betting Corporation (WROTBC) is one of five regional OTB corporations established and financed by their respective municipal sponsors following the enactment of permissive legislation by New York State in 1973.

WROTBC is an established "public benefit corportation," in that, it provides revenues to its member municipalities. Its geographical area is comprised of 18 counties, 15 of which participate as members of WROTBC, including the two cities of Buffalo and Rochester. The statutory objective of WROTBC is:

- 1) To prevent and curb illegal bookmaking while providing a reasonable revenue stream for the support of government.
- 2) To promote the well-being of horse racing and breeding industries in New York State.
- 3) To facilitate the local economy by providing employment to its residents.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH





Ricky Palermo Charity Concert

President and CEO Henry Wojtaszek presented representatives from the Ricky Palermo Foundation with a check for \$20,000 from ticket sales, food vendor, and chair rental fees from the Bruce in the USA concert which was held on June 10th.

The Fur Ball Gala Fundraiser on Saturday, March 4th, 2023 raised \$20,000 for Volunteers for Animals, the Animal Shelter of Genesee County, the SPCA of Wyoming County & the SPCA of Niagara County. Over 70 baskets donated by local companies were raffled off to the more than 160 persons in attendance.



OTB IN THE NEWS



Batavia Downs Reports Record Revenue From Wagers For 2022

Officials from Batavia Downs Gaming & Hotel formally closed the books on a record-breaking 2022. Credits played topped \$1 Billion for the first time ever. Net win totaled just over \$76 Million Dollars. That was up 14.5 percent or \$9.63 Million over 2021's numbers. Surcharge & Earnings to be distributed to member municipalities are projected to total \$9.2 Million, with earnings projected to be \$8.6 Million, a record amount since the Corporation's inception in 1974. This is an increase of 48 percent over the 2021 Surcharge & Earnings distributions to member municipalities of \$5.8 Million.

Batavia Downs Gaming contributed \$37.25 Million to State Education via the New York State Lottery. This number was also a record, beating 2021's number of \$32.55 Million by \$4.7 Million.

The Hotel at Batavia Downs, which was purchased by the corporation in the spring of 2021, has generated projected bottom-line revenues to the Corporation of \$675,000. The occupancy rate for the hotel was 78%, beating out last year's rate of 61 percent.

Batavia Downs' Food and Beverage outlets generated projected bottom-line revenues to the Corpo+ration of \$1.2 Million, a new record. Several improvements to Fortune's Steakhouse and a rebranding of the Homestretch Grill provided guests of Batavia Downs with new options when dining onsite.

"We are very encouraged by all we've accomplished in 2022," said Jacquelyne Leach, Chief Finan+cial Officer for Western OTB/Batavia Downs. "Our total distributions to municipalities are projected to be \$9.2 Million, bringing our total since our inception in 1974 to \$251 Million. At a tax rate of 49%, almost half of the money generated at Batavia Downs goes to NYS to help fund the State Education

Budget. We're proud to have given the highest amount we've

ever had back to the citizens of New York."

"These numbers showcase the positive direction of our facility," said Henry Wojtaszek, President and CEO of Batavia Downs. "In the post-Covid economy, we have begun adding events and expanding our promotions. By utilizing our onsite hotel and improving our food and beverage offerings, we have made Batavia Downs an entertainment destination."

"With our Summer Concert Series, Harness Racing Dates and marquee promotions all in the upcoming months, we're looking forward to contributing more to our member municipalities and the State Education Fund this year," Wojtaszek continued.

Batavia Downs had their three busiest days of all time, with each day reaching over \$5 million in credits played. Several record weeks topped \$24 Million in credits played.



Another Home Run For Batavia Downs Gaming

I've recently written several articles, including in the Buffalo News (Another Voice), about the amazing success of WROTBC/Batavia Downs Gaming in returning many millions of dollars to its member counties and cities to help reduce local property taxes since its inception 50 years ago.

The public benefit corporation supported by the cities of Buffalo and Rochester and 15 counties has been a resounding success under the leadership of Henry Wojtaszek and the current board and continues to set records from gaming revenue and hotel and entertainment returns at the very popular Batavia location just off the Thruway.

The latest numbers are a testament to how effective this public benefit corporation is run and the mega dollars it returns to its host members, in addition to employing 400 people.

To be more specific on the latest records we can report that from July 2 through July 8, it scored the top "net win" week of all time with \$1.9 million and the third best credits played week of \$24.08 million. Attendance topped 20,000 and hotel occupancy was over 80 percent.

Wojtaszek was very pleased to announce the numbers, saying we have reached a new high benchmark for play on our gaming floor "and that means local governments will get critical revenue" as a result of the efforts of the team that has been assembled at Batavia Downs/WROTBC. Wojtaszek also noted that \$930,000 will go to the state's education fund from the return for the record-breaking week. This is a public benefit corporation that delivers an amazing return. It just continues to amaze.
