In 2023, Western Regional Off-Track Betting Corporation (WROTBC) experienced remarkable growth, building on it's record success of 2022. This year, we saw unprecedented numbers, resulting in a substantial \$ 9.8 million distribution to our member municipalities. This increase from 2022's \$8.5 million distribution demonstrates the significant impact of our operations on local communities.

WROTBC, a public benefit corporation, supports 15 counties and two cities by providing revenue derived from our pari-mutuel wagering operations located throughout Western New York, coupled with the video gaming, food and beverage, hotel and event venues located within Batavia Downs.

Over 902,000 patrons visited Batavia Downs in 2023, breaking 2022's record by more than 73,000. Our jingle, "We want you to love coming here," is clearly resonating with our patrons. 

These are the "net" profits, after expenses, of OTB's major profit center for 2023.






REDUCING LOCAL PROPERTY TAX

Batavia Downs continued in 2023 with record breaking months and the highest yearly net win number of all time. The year end net win number of \$84.4 Million was a 11.1% increase over 2022's \$76 Million. Returning and new events helped introduce guests to the property, generating revenue from ticket sales, food and beverage purchases, and the gaming floor. The acquisition of the hotel proved to be an asset as Hotel Revenues were higher than the previous management team had ever seen. New strategies for generating bookings increased room revenue and allowed guests to visit all onsite amenities.

With record revenues from gaming, hotel, ticket, and restaurant outlets came record distributions to member municipalities – over \$9.7 Million was distributed amounts our 17 members in 2023.

Our Legal and "Statutory Objective"

The Western Regional Off-Track Betting Corporation (WROTBC) is one of five regional OTB corporations established and financed by their respective municipal sponsors following the enactment of permissive legislation by New York State in 1973.

WROTBC is an established "public benefit corportation," in that, it provides revenues to its member municipalities. Its geographical area is comprised of 18 counties, 15 of which participate as members of WROTBC, including the two cities of Buffalo and Rochester. The statutory objective of WROTBC is:

- 1) To prevent and curb illegal bookmaking while providing a reasonable revenue stream for the support of government.
- 2) To promote the well-being of horse racing and breeding industries in New York State.
- 3) To facilitate the local economy by providing employment to its residents.

Batavia Downs realized a 75% handle increase in 2023

With the books now finalized after the last live card of racing took place on Saturday (Dec. 9), Batavia Downs saw a major growth in handle that started last January during their first winter meet in 20 years and ended the year showing a 75% increase in wagering over the track's previous record high.

The total all-source handle for the entire 67 days of live racing conducted at the Downs in 2023 was \$15,414,846, which easily eclipsed the old record high of \$8,779,409 established in 2019 over that 63-day meet, and set a new all-time high wagering mark during Western Regional Off Track Betting's 21-year tenure as owner of the track.

Breaking down the numbers further, the average daily all-source handle of \$230,072 bested the old mark of \$146,987 set in 2021 (for a full-year schedule) by 57%. The average daily handle in 2020 was \$170,268, but it was during a Covid-shortened meet that ran only 42 days.

Another number that saw an uptick at the Downs in 2023 was the total on-track live handle of \$935,790, which rose 2.5% from the \$912,822 wagered last year.

"The momentum in the handle started during our winter meet when we set several daily records and picked right back up when we returned in July. I am very happy that the wagering support from our customers, both remote and live, carried over to our regular meet," said Don Hoover, Director of Live Racing at Batavia Downs.

Don Hoover Director of Live Racing The momentum Hoover eluded to started on Monday (Jan. 30) after bettors came out in force to pump \$340,602 (from all sources) through the windows to set a new all-time single card mark at Batavia Downs. That total was the largest handle recorded since WROTB reopened the Downs in 2002, and surpassed the old mark of \$339,000 which occurred during the 2019 New York Sire Stakes Night of Champions finals.

Then only a week later on Monday (Feb. 6), that record was broken again after \$348,205 was wagered on the very com-

petitive third leg card of the Western New York Pop-Up Series.

The healthy daily average handle for the short 14-day 2023 winter meet was \$238,895, and compared to \$227,742 for the 53 day summer/fall meet, remained almost identical all year despite increased competition by the greater number of tracks that raced live later in the year.

Batavia Downs will once again host a winter meet in 2024 and it begins on Thursday (Jan. 4) with 16 dates that run through Monday (Feb. 26). Post time for every race day will be 3 p.m.

'Net win' for Batavia Downs near \$2 million, a new record, on attendance of 20K

Western Region Off-Track Betting (WROTB) and Batavia Downs President and CEO Henry Wojtaszek announced that the week from Sunday, July 2nd through Saturday, July 8th was record-setting.



It was the top "net win" week of all time with \$1.9 Million and the 3rd best Credits Played week of \$24.08 million. Attendance topped 20,000 people for the week. Hotel Occupancy for the week was over 89%.

"We are so excited to have reached a new high benchmark for play on our gaming floor," Wojtaszek said. "A record week on the gaming floor means that local governments will get critical revenue as a result of the great work on the ground by our team. Also, the state's education fund will receive over \$930,000 from Batavia Downs from this last week's play. Our restaurants and hotel were packed throughout the holiday week."

Revenues from Batavia Downs' are distributed to their 17 Western New York municipalities: Cattaraugus County, Cayuga County, Chautauqua County, Erie County, Genesee County, Livingston County, Monroe County, Niagara County, Orleans County, Oswego County, Schuyler County, Seneca County, Steuben County, Wayne County, Wyoming County as well as the cities of Rochester and Buffalo.
