WHEREAS, it is the corporate responsibility of the Western Regional Off-Track Betting Corporation ("Western") to operate its various locations including its Batavia Downs Gaming location in a safe and efficient manner, while providing the best experience available to our patrons and employees; and

WHEREAS, Western is required to annually secure its video lottery gaming license surety bond in the amount of \$650,000.00, as required by New York State Gaming Commission Rules and Regulations in accordance with NYCRR Title 9, Executive Part 5103.5, the calculation of such bond requires a minimum coverage of 5 days of estimated average daily net win less an amount equal to the vendor's fee; and

WHEREAS, in May 2024, the RFP process was completed with three responses to provide Western with a broker of record for insurance coverages as needed. Upon board approval per Resolution 39-2024, Lawley Inc., ("Lawley") 361 Delaware Avenue, Buffalo, NY was selected as Broker of Record for a three (3) year term from June 1, 2024 through May 31, 2027; and

WHEREAS, Lawley Inc. recommends that Western obtain the required video lottery gaming license surety bond in the calculated amount of \$650,000.00 to be secured through Philadelphia Insurance Co. Group and payable to Lawley as broker at the annual cost of \$29,250.00 for the term 5/1/25 through 4/30/26; and now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that Western's Board of Directors hereby accepts to obtain the required video lottery gaming license surety bond in the amount of \$650,000.00 to be secured through Philadelphia Insurance Co. Group and payable to Lawley as broker at a cost of \$29,250.00; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an officer of Western is authorized to execute an agreement that reflects the Board's actions.

RESOLUTION # 38-2025

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of Western Regional Off-Track Betting Corporation ("Western") to operate its business in a manner that is both efficient and economically practical; and

WHEREAS, Western self-insures its Workers' Compensation exposures, requiring ongoing professional oversight and expertise, and has sent out a Request for Proposals to three (3) firms, with two (2) firms responding and;

WHEREAS, since 2019, Alterity Group has provided comprehensive oversight for Western's self-insured Workers' Compensation program, developing deep familiarity with Western's operations and regulatory requirements. This established relationship has been cost-effective, will minimize transition costs, and ensure continuity of service; and

WHEREAS, a designated review committee unanimously recommends to accept the proposal received from Alterity Group to provide these consulting services for an initial three (3) year term at a fixed annual cost of Thirty-Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$37,500)—a structure that remains more affordable than the alternative hourly proposal, while providing budgetary predictability—with the option for Western to renew for up to two (2) additional one (1) year periods, subject to a possible fee adjustment not to exceed five percent (5%) annually; and

WHEREAS, staff recommends that the Board of Directors of Western approve the agreement with Alterity Group under these terms; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of Western approves the proposed agreement for Workers' Compensation Consulting Services with Alterity Group for an initial three (3) year term at an annual amount of \$37,500, with the option for two (2) additional one-year renewals subject to a maximum increase of five percent (5%) per renewal; and be it further

RESOLVED, that an officer of Western is authorized to execute all documents as necessary in furtherance of the Board's approval and consent.

WHEREAS, Wendel Companies "Wendel", as engineer for said project and an evaluation committee, recommends the award for this project be made to Crosby-Brownlie Inc., "Crosby" 100 Nassau Street, Rochester, NY, the lowest responsible bidder in the amount of \$1,294,815.00; which is \$240,185.00 less in comparison with the second bid received; and now
